Sunday Worship: Moving Forward

Praise the Lord! Praise God in his sanctuary; praise him in his mighty heavens! Praise him for his mighty deeds; praise him according to his excellent greatness! Let everything that has breath praise the Lord! Praise the Lord!

Psalm 150: 1-2. 6

Take some time to read <u>all</u> of Psalm 150, six powerful verses written for worship. As God's people we are freed up to join our voices with the heavenly host in remembering God's mighty deeds especially those that have redeemed us in Jesus and have brought us to faith. We gather to praise him with everything we have. Notice, too, the variety of instruments and even dance that can be used to praise Him. He *is* worthy of our praise!

Before November 2018 our Praise Team was leading us in Sunday worship music twice a month, and since then they have led three times each month. It may take months, but in time they will lead worship each week.

Thank you for sharing

The Elders thank those who stayed after Bible Classes to discuss worship music on three consecutive Sundays in March. In addition to the three meetings, the elders received feedback by direct communication, by email, and from the Board of Directors. We gained much from those thrilled with the changes and from those who would rather not move in this direction. With your help we have received feedback that music selections have improved, and we are now more sensitive to introducing music at a pace that benefits the people of St. John.

In May of 2018 when the possibility of change was first introduced, we spoke of only using the organ for special events. We have come to see the benefit of adding in traditional organ hymns along with choir and other music selections as they fit with the readings and the needs of each service without limiting them to special occasions only. The majority of Sunday worship music will be led by our Praise Team each week.

What will NOT be changing

The chief components of our liturgy will continue to be present every week. We have gratefully received these from our Lutheran tradition. Together we will continue to share in the Scripture readings, the Sacraments, confession and absolution, prayer, the creeds, the Lord's Prayer, the Words of Institution, and in the Invocation and the Benediction. God uses these to serve us each week with His love and forgiveness.

We are committed to Lutheran doctrine and to clear Law and Gospel distinction in each message.

We have been experiencing music led by the Praise Team for many years. 



Board of Directors Meeting Minutes ~ March 2019

5th Sunday Serving Our City - Serving Opportunity will be 3/31/2019 at Pearl Health Clinic. We will serve a spaghetti dinner & have a Gospel message. Easter Eggs will be given away with an invite to SJLC for Easter and three will have tickets for a bigger Easter basket as a prize. Sign-ups are underway. **Hosted**: "A Welcoming Time Together" - These meetings began at City Bagel on 3/8/2019 & are scheduled for the 2nd Friday of each month. The start time was moved to 6:30 to better accommodate those who work on Fridays. **New Member Sunday** - Moved to Palm Sunday, so Pastor can attend the Men's Retreat at Camp Perkins on 3/22-24/2019. Paul P. will lead & preach. Mark P. will lead the Bible Study. Open talks of changes in Worship Music have gone well. ~Good listening. Good ideas have been shared from parishioners. Praise Band leadership has been open to suggestions. Our wording has become more precise. Oversight & selection of music is improving. Easter Brunch is planned after Easter worship on April 21 - Jr. & Sr. youth have been asked to help with meal & clean up, a free will donation will be used to assist in sending children to Camp Perkins. **Properties** - We have been experiencing water leaking into the Narthex. Mark and Dan V. were able to look into the Narthex roof space. We hired a drone photographer who took video & photos of the Narthex roof and the metal roof valleys surrounding it. We are scheduling repairs. We have a bid from Holeshot Plumbing for the new garbage disposal in the kitchen as well as new sinks and faucets. Due to the increase of minor repairs necessary for most of the toilets in the church, we also had Holeshot give a bid for replacing with new comfort-height toilets. Due to the expense of the upcoming roof repairs, however, we may not be able to do some of the work proposed. Here is the breakdown: Kitchen Option 1 - \$1,790 - Use existing sinks in kitchen but update with new goose-neck faucets and new basket strainers, install a new disposal in the 3-bay sink, and new drain pipes. We propose we proceed with this work. Kitchen Option 2 - \$3,780 - Instead of using the existing sinks, replacing them with new stainless steel sinks, faucets, & the disposal. We don't recommend this option due to high cost. Restroom Upgrades - \$1,895 -Removal & disposal of old toilets and replacing them with elongated comfort-height toilets, and seats with open front covers, new bowl wax and supply line. We propose waiting to proceed with this work until we see how much the roof repairs will cost. Problems continue with the floodlight; it stopped working around Ash Wednesday. Mark & Dan K. were able to find the location where the floodlight wiring enters the church building. We recommend contracting with Young Electric to completely rewire the floodlight. We will proceed with getting a bid. Two heat registers in the sanctuary are not producing heat according to Jeff P. He wants to bring Kevin G. in to look at them. We don't think this has taken place yet. We were planning on resurfacing the parking lot this spring. The cost will be approximately \$3,600. However, we may delay this work one more year depending on the cost of the roof repairs. We have received the yard maintenance contract from All American Yards. It was automatically renewed for this summer.
